ITINERARY

Day 1 May 8, Tuesday: Depart USA

This evening, depart from Newark Liberty International Airport for your overnight transatlantic flight to Venice, Italy. Dinner, breakfast and beverages will be served aloft. (D,B)

Day 2 May 9, Wednesday: Arrive Venice - Padua

Upon arrival at Venice Marco Polo Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim your luggage, and a Peter's Way Tours tour manager will meet you upon your exit from Customs. Board your comfortable touring bus and soon, you will be on your way to the lovely town of Padua. Here we visit the Basilica of St. Anthony with its famous Chapel of the Relics, which contain the actual tongue and lower jawbone of the Saint. The Basilica also contains a mixture of Gothic, Romanesque and Byzantine architecture and holds a huge collection of art treasures. **Today's Mass, prayer and reflection at the Shrine of St. Anthony.**

Check-in at hotel in Mestre.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Mestre. (D)

Day 3 May 10, Thursday: AM/Half-day Tour of Venice - PM/At Leisure

After breakfast, you will have a motor launch transfer to St. Mark's Square to explore this lovely and famous Lagoon City on the Adriatic Coast. Venice is like a giant maze, with its tiny alleys and hidden piazzas, linked by narrow footbridges over the many large and small canals. Begin our day with a walking tour at Venice's hub of activity, Piazza San Marco, which is lined with galleries, luxury shops and charming cafés. As you will see, dominating the Square is the magnificent Basilica San Marco, where the mixture of styles—Byzantine, Romanesque and Gothic—and profuse decoration, reflect Venice's history. Marvel at the shimmering mosaics encrusted on its interior walls, the precious sculptures and rare marbles. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Marco.** After Mass, we admire the Campanile, having simple lines contrasting sharply with the sumptuous decor of the Church and clock tower, where famous Moors have been striking the hours for over 500 years. Continue to the Bridge of Sighs, which connects to the Doge's Palace and the Piombi Prisons. The bridge is so named because of the sad laments of the prisoners as they were led across it to certain torture and possible death. Independent lunch followed by leisure time.

Don't miss out on an optional gondola trip, gliding along the picturesque canals with a local troubadour to serenade you.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Mestre. (B,D)

Day 4 May 11, Friday: Bologna - Florence

Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning, we leave Mestre and drive south to Florence; en route we

visit Bologna, the gastronomic capital of Italy. Throughout its long history—first as an Etruscan city, then a Roman one and then an independent city-state in the Middle Ages—Bologna has always been a power in the north of Italy. Bologna remained one of the best-preserved medieval cities in Europe; to this day, it remains unique in its historic value. Despite having suffered considerable bombing damage in 1944, Bologna's historic center, Europe's second largest (after Venice), contains a wealth of important medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque artistic monuments. Upon arrival, we visit the Basilica of San Dominic. **Celebrate Mass at the Arca di San Domenico** (Ark of Saint Dominic), a monument containing the remains of Saint Dominic. Following Mass, visit the cell where St. Dominic died and tour the Priory. Independent lunch.

Time will be given to explore Nettuno Square, with its elaborate Baroque fountain.

This afternoon, we drive through the gentle Tuscan hills that for centuries have inspired Saints, artists and admirers of beauty to the Renaissance city of Florence. Check-in at hotel in Florence.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Florence. (B,D)

Day 5 May 12, Saturday: AM/Academy of Fine Arts; Highlights of Florence – PM/At Leisure

Breakfast at your hotel.

This morning, our local guide will be ready to take you to visit the Accademia. This gallery was founded in 1784 by the Grand Duke Pietro Leopoldo, who decreed that all the schools of paintings should be joined together in a single academy. One of the most popular museums in Florence, it houses many sculptures by Michelangelo. Though the collection has since expanded to include works ranging from Florentine gothic painting to Russian Icons as well as Italian Renaissance and Baroque works by Pontormo, Ghirlandaio and others, it is still primary known for the superb “David” by Michelangelo. Continue to the beautiful Piazza Del Duomo and the delicately patterned green, white and pink Cathedral of Santa Maria Del Fiore, crowned with its magnificent Dome by Brunelleschi; Giotto's Bell Tower; and the Romanesque Baptistery of St. John, with the exquisite bronze doors by Ghiberti, which Michelangelo called the “Gates of Paradise.” See the 13th century Franciscan Church of the Holy Cross, which holds the Tombs of the greatest of Florentine men. **Celebrate Mass at the Franciscan Church of Santa Croce.**

Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we leave Florence on our comfortable motor coach for Assisi, one of the high points of any travel experience. After a two-and-a-half-hour ride, you will see Assisi on a mountaintop. The narrow lanes, the Shrines of Saint Francis and the overwhelming art dedicated to its young friar - a rich young man who turned to God after an illness and established an order that has grown stronger over the centuries. Check-in at hotel in Assisi.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Assisi. (B,D)

Day 6 May 13, Sunday: Assisi - Visit the Sites of St. Francis & St. Clare - Rome

Breakfast at your hotel. **Sunday Mass will be celebrated at the Basilica of St. Francis or St. Mary of the Angels.**

After breakfast, our local guide will take us to explore the Basilica complex, which is actually composed of two churches built one atop the other. Beneath both churches is the crypt that houses the tomb of St. Francis. The lower Basilica dates from 1228 to 1230, and is richly decorated with beautiful stained-glass windows, and paintings done by some of the most important artists of the 13th and 14th centuries. In the upper Basilica, built from 1230 - 1253, you will marvel at the monumental frescoes painted by Giotto, which depict scenes from the life of the Saint. We continue our visit at the Basilica of St. Clare, the first and most important heroine of the Franciscan movement, view her remains and see the miraculous Crucifix. Independent lunch and time will be given to visit the home of Favorino and Ortolana Schifi (Clare's parents), the Bishop's Palace in front of which Francis stripped his clothes and gave them to his father, and other sites of interest in town. This afternoon, we leave Assisi to visit the Basilica of Santa Maria degli Angeli, a great Basilica built in 1569 and crowned by the magnificent dome designed by Alessi. It encloses the shrine of the "Porziuncula," or the Little Portion Chapel, around which the first Franciscan community was centered, the place where Clare received the habit from Francis, and the Capella Del Transito, which marks the spot where the Saint died. You will see the statue of Saint Francis in the courtyard, where thornless roses bloom. Continue to the "Eternal City," Rome! History evolving over 2,500 years will be made visible for you by the Roman ruins, 15th century churches, 17th century palaces and 20th century monuments.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 7 May 14, Monday: AM/Tour of Christian Rome - PM/Tour of Ancient Rome

After breakfast, begin your day with a visit to the magnificent Basilica of St. Paul, built by Constantine in the 4th century on the site of St. Paul's tomb. Surrounding the nave are the medallions of each Pope, from Peter to Benedict XVI. **Celebrate Mass at the Basilica of St. Paul Outside the Walls.** Continue your tour to the Cathedral of St. John Lateran, the first Christian church to be consecrated. It was founded by the Emperor Constantine in the 4th century and was home to the Popes for many years prior to the present Vatican residence. End your morning tour with a visit to the Basilica of St. Mary Major, one of the four major Basilicas built by Pope Sixtus III (AD 432-440). View the impressive interior with its remarkable mosaics in the nave depicting scenes from the Old Testament. The mosaics above the entablature are among the most ancient Christian mosaics in Rome. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we visit the Church of St. Peter in Chains to see the original chains in which St. Peter was brought captive to Rome and the statue of Moses, one of Michelangelo's greatest masterpieces. Then, we continue to the ancient Roman Forum. Then, see the Arch of Titus and the Arch of Constantine and proceed to outside of the Coliseum for a fascinating explanation of its history. Continue on to the grandiose white marble monument of King Victor Emmanuel II, often called the "Wedding Cake." See the Trajan Column and the Market (the ancient Roman equivalent of a department store). Visit the Trevi Fountain to toss in a coin to ensure your "Arrivederci, Roma."

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 8 May 15, Tuesday: Full-day Excursion to Pompeii

After breakfast, drive south on the Autostrada del Sol, "Sun Route," via the regions of Lazio and Campania for Naples and Pompeii. Upon arrival we visit Pompeii, and explore the incredibly well-preserved remains of this ancient Roman town, where all life was suddenly stopped by an eruption of Vesuvius in the year 79 AD. Pompeii was destroyed, and completely buried, during a long catastrophic eruption of the volcano Mount Vesuvius spanning two days. The volcano collapsed higher roof-lines and buried Pompeii under 60 feet of ash and pumice, and it was lost for nearly 1700 years before its accidental rediscovery in 1748. Since then, its excavation has provided an extraordinarily detailed insight into the life of a city at the height of the Roman Empire. Today, it is one of the most popular tourist attractions of Italy. **Celebrate Mass at the Franciscan Basilica of the Rosary.**

Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we return to Rome.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Rome. (B,D)

Day 9 May 16, Wednesday: AM/Papal Audience - PM/Vatican Museums & Sistine Chapel - Evening/Farewell Dinner

After early breakfast, **celebrate Mass at Santa Anna Church** near the Vatican. After Mass, **enter the heart of Christendom for an audience with our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI.** Our pilgrimage will be acknowl-

edged during the English language portion.

Independent lunch. This afternoon, visit one of the great art collections in the world, the Vatican Museums. Walk in the footsteps of the Princes of the Church through the richly decorated galleries. Continue on to the Sistine Chapel, the private chapel of the Popes, where Michelangelo best expressed his genius in monumental frescoes. End your tour in St. Peter's Basilica. Take in the awesome architecture and the statuary adorning this largest of all Christian churches, including Michelangelo's magnificent "Pieta." Pray at the new tomb of Blessed John Paul II, in St. Sebastian's Chapel. On your own, with time permitting, you may wish to go to the Vatican Crypt to see and pray near the tomb of St. Peter and where numerous pontiffs are buried, among incredible works of art. Return to your hotel to freshen up.

This evening, be prepared to have your culinary senses titillated at "Azienda Agricolo II Castellacio," the location for your farewell dinner. Italians preserve a sense of food as theater. Dinner is at once a drama to be witnessed in stages with mounting surprise and delight, and a sacrament to be shared in affirmation of bonds of love. Azienda Agricolo II Castellacio, a charming hilltop farmhouse offers a warm welcome in the incomparably beautiful scenery of the Agro Roman Country. In this dining atmosphere of hospitality and friendship, enjoy the taste of the Mediterranean with wine and music.

Overnight at hotel in Rome.

Day 10 May 17, Thursday: Return to the USA

After breakfast, you will be transferred to Rome Airport for your return flight to the USA. (B)

Your pilgrimage includes:

- Round-trip jet economy class transportation: Newark/Venice - Rome/Newark.
- U.S. departure tax; Customs user fee; security tax and all airport departure taxes.
- Meeting and assistance upon departure from Newark Liberty International Airport.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PAYMENT: Deposits and insurance payments will be accepted in the form of check or money order only. In an effort to keep our prices as low as possible, it is recommended that all payments be made via check or money order. However, it is possible to make your final payment via MasterCard, Visa, Discover, or American Express. A convenience fee of \$100.00 will apply to your account. Invoices and credit card authorization forms will be included with your welcome documents. The credit card form must be completed in entirety in order for the transaction to be approved.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round-trip from Newark. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. By sending your deposit together with your completed reservation form before the deposit deadline, airfare will be guaranteed against future fare increases. Airlines will provide a block of seats for the group. Individual requests for seating preferences can be made at time of check-in only. If you are a member of the frequent flyer or affiliate program, please bring your account card to the airport on the day of departure to receive proper mileage credit.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing twin bedded rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout your tour. Triple rooms are available for family or friends traveling together. We discourage triple room accommodations because they are normally not spacious and there is no discount for triple occupancy. Triple rooms usually are regular twin or double-bedded rooms with a cot or rollaway bed added. Single rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of \$750.00. While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than twin rooms and may be poorly located and are sometimes located away from the group in a different area of the hotel, and may be in high traffic areas, such as stairways/elevators. We honestly do not like to assess an additional charge for the single traveler and will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same gender roommate when we receive your application, but we do not guarantee a roommate can be matched. If there is no one with whom you can share accommodations or your roommate cancels, you will be charged the single room supplement fee.

MEALS: Buffet breakfast and dinner daily, including a farewell dinner with wine and entertainment at Azienda Agricola II Castellaccio. With the exception of wine during the farewell dinner, beverages (coffee, tea, mineral water) are not included at set menu dinners.

TRANSFER AND PORTERAGE: Round-trip private transfers from/to hotel. Porterage of one piece of luggage, per person, throughout your tour at hotels. Although the airlines will allow you to check two pieces of luggage, we strongly suggest that you travel with one suitcase and one carry-on.

Deviation fee will apply plus an airline change fee per person. Your routing and dates requested will determine if a difference in airfare will also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact our office for detailed information.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: From the time your deposit is received up to 130 days prior to departure, there is a \$150.00 nonrefundable cancellation fee per person. From 129 to 100 days prior to departure, the cancellation fee will be \$350.00 per person. BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE: Due to bus space, one carry-on bag and one checked bag per person is permitted. SIGHTSEEING AND ENTRANCE FEES: All sightseeing as per itinerary aboard a private motor coach with the services of a professional, licensed, English-speaking guide. Entrance fees to all sights are included.

TIPPING/SERVICE CHARGES: All gratuities to tour manager/guides, drivers, escorts and dining rooms are included. Although these service charges are included, it is customary to leave Euro 1.00 per person to the maid for housekeeping.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: All passengers must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others as pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, climbing up/down stairs, etc. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. If special assistance is required, the passenger must travel with a companion willing and capable of providing any necessary assistance.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: It is strongly recommended that all participants buy insurance when they travel since the tour operator is not responsible for lost or damaged luggage or trip interruption.
