We hope you will accompany us on this memorable, grace-filled journey. Join us as we discover "Lourdes, Shrines of Spain and Fatima!"

ITINERARY

Day 1 May 17, Tuesday: Depart USA

This evening, depart New York's JFK International Airport via Air France for your overnight transatlantic flight to Lourdes via Paris. Dinner, breakfast and beverages will be served aloft. (D,B)

Day 2 May 18, Wednesday: Paris - Lourdes

Upon arrival at Charles de Gaulle International Airport, go through Passport Control and soon you will be connecting to another Air France flight to Pau Airport near Lourdes.

Upon arrival in Lourdes, claim your luggage, and a Peter's Way Tours tour manager/guides will meet you. Your luggage will be transferred to your bus and soon you will be on your way to Lourdes.

A picture book castle and the "Grotto" dominate Lourdes, where the "Beautiful Lady" appeared to Bernadette. Most people have a mental image of Lourdes, which dissolves the instant they visit the town. Few are prepared by what they have read or seen in pictures to grasp the sheer beauty of the place. It is more dramatic and larger than you expect. The people you meet there are the most amazing part of the entire experience. They seem possessed of a loving spirit, which almost puts electricity in the air. At night, they stroll the narrow streets singing aloud, laughing and full of joy. They come from all nations. If you cannot always understand their languages, you can easily understand their smiles. Whether they experience another miracle or not, they consider it miracle enough to find themselves as pilgrims, at last, in Lourdes.

Check-in at hotel in Lourdes. Freshen up.

6:00 pm, Celebrate Mass at the Chapel of Poor Clares.

Dinner at your hotel. **After dinner, participate in the evening candlelight Rosary procession.**

Overnight at hotel in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 3 May 19, Thursday: Full day in Lourdes

Breakfast at your hotel. **Morning Mass at the Grotto.**

This morning, participate in the walking tour of Lourdes where the group will visit the places associated with the life of Bernadette. The places include the Boly Mill, where St. Bernadette was born; the Locale Mill, residence of her parents; the "Cochot," formerly used as a jail where she lived at the time of the Apparitions; the Chapel where St. Bernadette received her First Holy Communion; and the Parish church containing the Baptismal Font where she was baptized.

Independent lunch.

Your afternoon is free for private devotions, visiting the Grotto and confession. There will be an opportunity for the sick to take part in the Miraculous Baths. You may make the outdoor Stations, if you are able, and attend the Blessing of the Sick, one of the most inspiring events at the shrine.

Leisure time follows. Perhaps you will take an optional visit of the sanctuaries. In a square to the side is the Chapel of Reconciliation where the Redemptorist Fathers are available for confessions in many languages.

Dinner at your hotel.

After dinner, join in the candlelight procession and in reciting the Rosary and singing hymns to the Mother of God.

Overnight at hotel in Lourdes. (B,D)

Day 4 May 20, Friday: Lourdes - Andorra - Barcelona

Early Mass at the Chapel of Poor Clares. Return to your hotel for breakfast. After breakfast, leave Lourdes and travel south through the Pyrenees Mountains and across the French/Spanish border to Barcelona via Andorra. Andorra is located in the eastern Pyrenees Mountains and bordered by Spain and France. It has an area of approximately 470 km (181 sq mi) with an estimated population of 84,484 in 2008. Its capital is Andorra la Vella. It is a prosperous country mainly because of its tourism industry and its status as a tax haven. Andorra is the sixth smallest nation in Europe. **Lunch at a restaurant in Andorra included in the program.**

After lunch, we continue to Barcelona and arrive early evening.

Check-in at hotel.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Barcelona. (B,L,D)

Day 5 May 21, Saturday: Montserrat and Highlight Tour of Barcelona, including Sagrada Familia

Buffet breakfast at your hotel. This morning, we visit the Benedictine Abbey of Montserrat. For over a thousand years, pilgrims from everywhere in Europe have made their way to the Benedictine Shrine of the Cherished Black Madonna, said to have been carved by St. Luke. Visit the Shrine of Our Lady of Montserrat and the Benedictine Monastery standing 2,379 feet above sea level, surrounded by jagged peaks and massive rock formations that present a fantastic primeval appearance. **Celebrate Mass at the Shrine.** Independent lunch.

After lunch, our local guide will introduce us to Barcelona. We see one of the most beautiful examples of the Catalan Gothic style with the imposing Santa Maria del Mar Church. From there, we head toward the Gothic Quarter and the magnificent Cathedral. Continue to visit the Palau de la Generalitat, the Town Hall, the small streets that lead to the Plaza Real, Avenue Paseo de Garcia and Las Ramblas, an area joining the statue of Columbus with the Plaza Catalunya, passing through the Boqueria Market. Then, we continue to the art deco works of native Antonio Gaudi (1852 - 1926), Sagrada Familia (Church of the Holy Family). Due to Gaudi's untimely death, the Church on which he had first started to work in 1884 was left incomplete in 1926. The design was begun in conventional Neo-Gothic. He completed the crypt, the famous Nativity facade with its four tall spires and the porch laden with naturalistic sculpture. The work was restarted in 1940, however, at a great disadvantage. Gaudi had left no plans and no one was able to imitate his free interpretation of Gothic motifs. The Church has become a symbolic monument for Barcelona, visited by more people than any other site. Continue to see the Guell Palace, the Pavilions and Guell Park with Gaudi's home-museum. Then, we continue on to Montjuich Hill, the site of the 1992 Olympics, and enjoy a spectacular view of Barcelona and its port area.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Barcelona. (B,D)

Day 6 May 22, Sunday: Barcelona – Zaragoza - Madrid

After early buffet breakfast, we leave Barcelona for Zaragoza. One of the great monumental towns in Spain, Zaragoza was founded over 2,000 years ago. Still evident in the city are the remains of the Old Iberian, Roman, Gothic and Arabian empires that ruled long ago. Zaragoza presents an impressive landscape with picturesque villages and some of the most important buildings of the Spanish baroque style. Upon arrival, we visit the Basilica of Our Lady of the Pillars, one of the most visited pilgrimage spots in the entire country because Our Lady visited Zaragoza before her Assumption into Heaven. Tradition holds that Our Lady, while still alive, appeared to St. James at the Ebro River to encourage him in his evangelization. As a sign of her protection, Mary left him the pillar with her statue. The pillar, which still emits an extraordinary fragrance, can be venerated in the church. The building, constructed in 1681, is flanked by four towers. Its cupola boasts murals painted by Goya, and the church museum houses a large collection of religious art.

Our Lady of the Pillar ("Pilar" in Spanish, a name fondly bestowed on women in Spanish-speaking countries throughout the world). The Virgin of Pillar is the Patroness not only of Spain but also of all Hispanic nations (Feast Day: Oct. 12*). *Observed, not as "Columbus Day," but as "Dia de la Raza," literally "The Day of Our Race," a kind of "Spanish solidarity" celebration.

Celebrate Mass at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Pillar.

Lunch in Zaragoza included.

This afternoon, we continue to Madrid for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Madrid.

Day 7 May 23, Monday: Royal Palace & Highlight Tour of Madrid

Buffet breakfast at your hotel. **Begin our day with Mass at Almudena Cathedral in Madrid.** After Mass, we visit the Royal Palace, built for Spain's royalty in the 18th century. King Juan Carlos I and Queen Sophia continue to use it today for many state functions. The surrounding area is one of the most beautiful palatial complexes in all Europe and includes the Plaza de Oriente, the Sabatini Gardens and the Campo del Moro. Independent lunch.

This afternoon, enjoy a glimpse of some of Madrid's most outstanding attractions, like the Puerta del Sol, the magnificent fountains of Neptune and Cibeles, the stately Alcala Gate, the busy Gran Via, the Plaza de Espana, the Plaza de Oriente, and finish at the historical and impressive Plaza Mayor.

Balance of the day at leisure to enjoy Madrid on your own.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Madrid.

Day 8 May 24, Tuesday: El Escorial Monastery - Avila

Buffet breakfast at your hotel. This morning, leave Madrid to visit the world famous El Escorial Monastery dating from the 16th century, more properly, San Lorenzo del Escorial, the burial place of Spanish kings and queens. This monastery was built by Philip II as a memorial to his father, Charles V. A vast rectangular building, it was conceived and executed with a monotonous magnificence. The Church itself is in the shape of a Greek cross and contains a famous cross created by Benvenuto Cellini. We, then, continue to "Valle de Los Caídos"—a memorial to the million men slaughtered on both sides in Spain's terrible Civil War. This is a temple of monumental proportions, crowned by a huge cross and several sculptures by Juan de Avalos. The main basilica is an excavation within a mountain with a long stairway leading to the entrance. It took twenty years to accomplish this feat and prisoners of the Spanish Civil War did the work. The crypt of Valle de los Caídos holds the remains of many of those who fought in that war. **Celebrate Mass in El Escorial.** Independent lunch.

After lunch, we continue to Avila, the City of Kings and of Saints, completely encircled by 11th Century walls. This is the birthplace of St. Teresa, one of the greatest mystics and Doctor of the Church. Upon arrival, we tour Avila. Avila possesses one of the best-preserved Medieval fortified precincts of Europe. In the course of our walk within its city wall, we will gaze at innumerable Medieval palaces and large homes belonging to Velada, Valderrabanos, Nunez Vela and Guzmanes, its beautiful cathedral and Saint Vincent's Basilica, an impressive piece of Romanesque architecture. But no road can ignore the life and work of the great mystic Saint Teresa of Avila, evidenced in both the Carmelite Monastery of the Incarnation and the home of her birth.

Check-in at hotel in Avila. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Avila.

Day 9 May 25, Wednesday: Avila – Ciudad Rodrigo - Fatima

Buffet breakfast at your hotel. **Celebrate Mass at the Monastery of the Incarnation.** Then, we leave Avila on our journey to Fatima. En route, we stop in Ciudad Rodrigo. Independent lunch.

Then, we continue to Fatima, the sacred place where the Blessed Mother appeared in 1917 to three simple shepherd children and exhorted mankind to pray for world peace.

After settling into your hotel, you may wish to participate in the evening Eucharistic Procession.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Fatima.

Day 10 May 26, Thursday: Full day in Fatima

Buffet breakfast at your hotel. **This morning, celebrate Holy Mass at the Little Chapel of Apparitions.** Then, your guide will take you on a tour of the Shrine of Fatima. In May 1917, Our Lady was seen several times by three shepherd children -- Jacinta, Francisco and Lucia, at a place called Cova da Iria, where the Basilica now stands. Visit the tombs of the children, and the Chapel of the Apparitions known as the Capelinha. Visit Aljustrel, the hamlet where the three children lived and view their untouched homes. Continue on to Valinhos where Our Lady appeared after the children's return from prison. The children were taught this prayer by Our Lady of Fatima; *'O my Jesus, forgive us our sins, save us from the fires of hell, lead all souls to Heaven, especially those who have most need of your mercy.'* Independent lunch, followed by afternoon at leisure.

Join pilgrims from around the world in an evening candlelight procession to pray the rosary. Don't forget your white handkerchiefs for the Adeus farewell, when thousand of pilgrims wave a loving farewell to the statue of Our Lady of the Rosary.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Fatima.

(B,D)

Day 11 May 27, Friday: Fatima - Santarem - Lisbon

Breakfast at your hotel. This morning, we leave Fatima to visit the town of Santarem. A short walk through narrow streets leads to the Church of St. Stephen, where you will behold the Eucharistic Miracle known as the Holy Miracle of Santarem, a relic that's been kept here since 1269. View the Venerated Relic of the "Bleeding Host." Prayer and reflection in the shrine. Then, we continue to Lisbon.

(Independent lunch en route).

This afternoon, your panoramic tour of Lisbon will include an overview of St. George's Castle, where one can get a magnificent view of the city. Then, we visit the birthplace of St. Anthony of Padua, now a church. **Celebrate Mass at the Shrine.** After Mass, visit Jeronomos Monastery, one of the finest examples of Portuguese Manueline Art (late Gothic), Belem Tower and the Monument to the Discoveries.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Lisbon.

(B,D)

Day 12 May 28, Saturday: Return to the USA

Early morning, you will be transferred to Lisbon Airport for your return flight to the USA.

Your pilgrimage includes:

- Round-trip jet economy class transportation via Air France New York/Paris/Lourdes – Lisbon/Paris/New York.
- U.S. departure tax; Customs user fee; security tax and all airport departure taxes.
- Meeting and assistance upon departure from New York's JFK International Airport.
- Ten (10) nights' accommodations in twin rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout.
- Buffet breakfast and dinner daily, as per attached itinerary.
- Two lunches (which include wine and water) in a restaurant, as per attached itinerary.
- Services of a Peter's Way Tours government-licensed, English-speaking tour manager/guide upon arrival to departure in France.
- All sightseeing as per the attached itinerary, including overseas arrival and departure transfers, in a private air-conditioned motor coach.
- Entrance fees to all sites, as per attached itinerary.
- Gratuities to the tour manager/guide and driver.
- Portage of one piece of luggage per person at hotels throughout your tour.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PAYMENT: Deposits and insurance payments will be accepted in the form of check or money order only. In an effort to keep our prices as low as possible, it is recommended that all payments be made via check or money order. However, it is possible to make your final payment via MasterCard, Visa, Discover, or American Express. A convenience fee of \$100.00 will apply to your account. Invoices and credit card authorization forms will be included with your welcome documents. The credit card form must be completed in entirety in order for the transaction to be approved.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Round-trip from New York via Air France. Flight itinerary and carrier may be subject to change. Airfare is subject to increases prior to date of travel. By sending your deposit together with your completed reservation form before the deposit deadline, airfare will be guaranteed against future fare increases, excluding tax increases or fuel surcharges. Airlines will provide a block of seats for the group. Individual requests for seating preferences can be made at time of check-in only. If you are a member of the frequent flyer or affiliate program, please bring your account card to the airport on the day of departure to receive proper mileage credit.

ACCOMMODATIONS/SINGLE TRAVELERS: Price per person is based on two persons sharing twin bedded rooms with private facilities in hotels throughout your tour. Triple rooms are available for family or friends traveling together. We discourage triple room accommodations because they are normally not spacious and there is no discount for triple occupancy. Triple rooms usually are regular twin or double-bedded rooms with a cot or rollaway bed added. Single rooms are limited but may be requested at time of booking for an additional charge of **\$695.00**. While single rooms provide privacy, they are often smaller than twin rooms and may be poorly located and are sometimes located away from the group in a different area of the hotel, and may be in high traffic areas, such as stairways/elevators. We honestly do not like to assess an additional charge for the single traveler and will make every effort (if you so desire) to match you with a same gender roommate when we receive your application, but we do not guarantee a roommate can be matched. If there is no one with whom you can share accommodations or your roommate cancels, you will be charged the single room supplement fee.

MEALS: Buffet breakfast and dinner daily, as per attached itinerary. With the exception of wine and water during the two lunches, beverages (coffee, tea, mineral water) are not included at set menu dinners.

TRANSFER AND PORTERAGE: Round-trip private transfers from/to hotel. Porterage of one piece of luggage, per person, throughout your tour at hotels. Although the airlines will allow you to check two pieces of luggage, we strongly suggest that you travel with one suitcase and one carry-on.

SERVICE CHARGES FOR ITINERARY CHANGES: Peter's Way is pleased to assist clients with changes in itineraries (All deviation requests must be submitted in writing at least 90 days prior to departure). Deviation fee will apply plus an airline change fee per person. Your routing and dates requested will determine if a difference in airfare will also apply. Not all carriers permit routing changes and/or deviations from the group itinerary. Please contact our office for detailed information.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: From the time your deposit is received up to 130 days prior to departure, there is a \$150.00 nonrefundable cancellation fee per person. From 129 to 100 days prior to departure, the cancellation fee will be \$350.00 per person. For cancellations received from 99 days prior up to the day of departure the cancellation fee will be 100% of package price per person including taxes, single supplement, deviations fees and any other costs incurred (if applicable). (Travel insurance is offered as protection in case of illness, please see TRAVEL INSURANCE). **Tour participation is non-transferable. Names cannot be transferred on reservations or airline tickets.** Refund requests (if applicable) can only be honored when submitted in writing to Peter's Way Tours. All refund requests are subject to cancellation restrictions as set forth above. No refund will be made for any accommodations or services included in the tour that you do not use.

BAGGAGE ALLOWANCE: Due to bus space, one carry-on bag and one checked bag per person is permitted. Standard airline baggage policies usually allow checked baggage up to 62 total inches and range to 50 pounds and carry-on baggage up to 45 total inches and 11 to 40 pounds. However, policies may vary from the time of printing of this brochure. Contact your airline directly before departure for current baggage dimension allowances. For luggage exceeding the allowed limits, excess baggage fees will apply at check-in. Our final documents will contain current information applicable to your designated airline.

LAND ONLY PASSENGERS: A passenger choosing the land only portion of the package (**\$2,895.00 per person, sharing a twin**) must notify Peter's Way, **in writing**, 100 days prior to date of departure or a penalty fee will be assessed. *Please be advised, passenger(s) opting for the land only package or who are deviating from the group itinerary will be responsible for their own transfers to/from hotel/airport. However, if you arrive at the same time or earlier than your group, you are welcome to join the group on the bus.*

SIGHTSEEING AND ENTRANCE FEES: All sightseeing as per itinerary aboard a private motor coach with the services of a professional, licensed, English-speaking guide. Entrance fees to all sights are included.

REFUNDS: Refund requests (if applicable) can be only honored when submitted in writing to Peter's Way/FMA. All refund requests are subject to cancellation restrictions set forth above.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: All participants must have a valid passport. U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months, subsequent to the return date. Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current requirements. It is solely the passenger's responsibility to ensure that all documents needed are completed and current. Peter's Way will not be held responsible for lack of current and valid entry documents.

TIPPING/ SERVICE CHARGES: All gratuities to tour manager/guides, drivers, escorts and dining rooms are included. Although these service charges are included, it is customary to leave Euro 1.00 per person to the maid for housekeeping.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: All passengers must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others as pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, climbing up/down stairs, etc. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. If special assistance is required, the passenger must travel with a companion willing and capable of providing any necessary assistance.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: It is strongly recommended that all participants buy insurance when they travel since the tour operator is not responsible for lost or damaged luggage or trip interruption. Peter's Way offers an optional comprehensive Passenger Travel Protection Insurance Policy. These benefits and services help insure the well being of the passenger while traveling worldwide. The insurance premiums are based on total package price, including single supplements, deviation fees, late charges, etc. The premium for total package prices from \$3,001.00 and over is \$199.00. **If the insurance payment is made at the time of deposit or within 10 days of receiving the Peter's Way "Tour Deposit Acknowledgment Letter," the passenger will be covered for pre-existing conditions. However, the insurance policy can be purchased at anytime thereafter, excluding coverage for pre-existing conditions, until final payment has been made. Insurance payments will not be accepted after final payment has been made. All insurance premiums are non-refundable.**
